

## UNIVERSITY OF CANTERBURY INTERNATIONAL DOCTORAL SCHOLARSHIPS

1. University of Canterbury International Doctoral Scholarships are tenable by international students for study towards the degree of Doctor of Philosophy at the University of Canterbury. Citizens and permanent residents of New Zealand are not eligible to hold the award. The scholarships provide for a living allowance, tuition fees and a travel grant, each to a value determined by the Council (see *Note* below for their current number and value).
2. For eligible students, an application for a University of Canterbury Doctoral Scholarship constitutes an application for a University of Canterbury International Doctoral Scholarship; and no separate application is necessary.
3. A scholar in receipt of an award must enrol in a doctoral programme by 1 October (for those applying by 15 October) or 1 May (for those applying by 15 May) in the year following application. A scholar unable to enrol by this deadline must seek permission from the Academic Board to take up the scholarship at a later date, without which permission the award will be terminated.
4. A scholar may not apply for any other University of Canterbury scholarship for the same degree.
5. University of Canterbury International Doctoral Scholarships are not tenable by part-time or extra-mural students.
6.
  - a) The grant-in-aid for travel is normally paid toward travel from the scholar's home country to Christchurch at the start of the study period, and the return trip at the conclusion of the study period.
  - b) If the scholar becomes a citizen or permanent resident of New Zealand during the tenure of the scholarship he or she will be transferred to a University of Canterbury Doctoral Scholarship. No further grant in aid will be payable, but the emolument and fees payment will continue.
  - c) Travel arrangements must be made through the University's approved travel agent, and paid by the Scholarships Office. The travel grant will not be paid directly to the scholar.
7. The other regulations for the University of Canterbury International Doctoral Scholarship are the same as University of Canterbury Doctoral Scholarships Regulations 2, 3, 4(a), and 5 to 11

Note: *The current emolument of a scholarship is NZ\$25,000 per EFTS. In addition to this, the scholarships cover tuition fees for the thesis enrolment at the New Zealand domestic rate for the term of the scholarship, and an economy class airfare at the start and end of tenure. The University expects to offer up to 5 Scholarships in each year.*
