### 1. Aronga | Purpose

This scholarship is to support outstanding graduate students of Japanese, whose native language is not Japanese, to further their studies towards a higher degree in a field of Japanese language and/or culture.

### 2. Paearu māraurau | Eligibility criteria

- 2.1 Applicants must be citizens or permanent residents of New Zealand, excluding native speakers of Japanese. <sup>1</sup>
- 2.2 Applicants must be graduates of Te Whare Wānanga o Waitaha | University of Canterbury enrolled, or intending to enrol, in a postgraduate programme in a field of Japanese studies at the University of Canterbury or at a university in Japan. Normally, the programme will be for a BA (Hons), master's or doctoral degree.

### 3. Tukanga tononga | Application process

- 3.1 Applications must be made online at the Scholarships website<sup>2</sup> by 31 March.
- 3.2 No candidate will be ineligible for the scholarship by reason of having held it in a previous year or years.

### 4. Tukanga kōwhiringa | Selection process

- 4.1 One scholarship, tenable for one year, is available annually. However, if in any year there are two candidates of equal merit, the award may be shared.
- 4.2 The scholarship is awarded by Te Kaunihera | University Council on the recommendation of a selection committee comprising:

- a. the Tumu Whakarae | Vice-Chancellor (or nominee); and
- b. HOD of the School of Languages, Social & Political Sciences.

## 5. Paearu kōwhiringa | Selection criteria

- 5.1 In making the recommendation, the selection committee gives equal consideration to:
  - a. Academic achievement; and
  - b. The applicant's proposed study; and
  - c. The applicant's financial circumstances.
- 5.2 If, in any year, there is no candidate of sufficient merit, no scholarship is offered. In such a case an additional award may be offered in the following year; otherwise, the value of the unawarded scholarship will be added to the capital of the fund.

## 6. Mahere utu | Value and payment schedule

- 6.1 The scholarship provides financial assistance at a value of \$2000.00.
- 6.2 The scholarship is paid by direct credit to the recipient's nominated Aotearoa New Zealand bank account in one instalment.
- 6.3 Payment is made as soon as practicable after enrolment in the specified programme is confirmed.

## 7. Paearu here | Tenability and retention criteria

- 7.1 Recipients should be enrolled in the applicable programme within 12 months of being offered the scholarship.
- 7.2 The scholarship is tenable by graduates of Te Whare Wānanga o Waitaha | University of Canterbury for a postgraduate programme in a field of Japanese studies at the University of Canterbury or at a university in Japan. Normally, the programme will be for a BA (Hons), master's or doctoral degree.
- 7.3 The scholarship is tenable for one year.
- 7.4 The scholarship is co-tenable with any other award unless the conditions of the other award preclude this.
- 7.5 The scholarship may be withdrawn, and any paid funds may be recovered if, during tenure, the recipient does not:
  - a. maintain an enrolment that meets the conditions specified in clause 7.2;
  - b. maintain satisfactory academic engagement;<sup>3</sup> and
  - c. adhere to the University's statutes, regulations, policies, and rules.

## 8. Whakamahuki | Background information

The award was established in 1990 in memory of Dr Barbara Mito Reed (1955-1990), a graduate in Japanese of the University of Canterbury, by her husband, Mr T. Mito, her family and friends.
