Glossary of terms

Students

EFTStudent

Equivalent Full-Time Student. The EFTStudent system is a method of counting tertiary student numbers. The basis of the system is that a student taking a normal year's full-time study equals 1.0 EFTStudent unit. Part-time students are counted as fractions of one EFTStudent unit, depending on their course load.

Domestic

A student who is a New Zealand citizen; an Australian citizen; or a permanent resident of New Zealand.

International

All students who are full-fee paying foreign students, students on Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade (MFAT) scholarships, students on approved international exchange schemes and families of diplomatic or military staff. This excludes overseas students who are New Zealand citizens, permanent residents of New Zealand, or Australian citizens.

Full Fee Paying

A student who meets full tuition costs on their own or from funds provided to them by sponsors other than the New Zealand Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade (MFAT).

Staff

FTE Staff

Full-Time Equivalent Staff. The FTE Staff system is a method of counting staff positions. The basis of the system is that a full-time staff position equals 1.0 FTE Staff unit. Part-time positions are counted as fractions of one FTE Staff unit, depending on hours established.

Academic

For reporting purposes, a staff member employed to perform the functions of teaching and/or research.

General

For reporting purposes, a staff member employed to perform functions other than teaching and/or research. The General Staff category includes all staff not identified as academic staff.

Other

Financial Recovery Plan (FRP)

The University of Canterbury Financial Recovery Plan provides a framework for the restoration of financial viability for the University. It covers the period 2002-2006.

Canterbury Tertiary Alliance (CTA)

The Canterbury Tertiary Alliance (CTA) came into being in 2001 with the formal signing of a deed of cooperation between the University of Canterbury, the Christchurch Polytechnic Institute of Technology (CPIT) and the Christchurch College of Education (CCE). In 2002 these founding institutions were joined by Lincoln University. The goal of the alliance is to maximise cooperation in best practice, cost efficiencies and collegiality between the participating institutions.

PBRF

The Performance Based Research Fund is a new mechanism for funding research in the tertiary education sector. Research funds will be allocated through the PBRF according to the quality of the research produced in each institution. The PBRF will be introduced progressively from 2004.

TEC

The Tertiary Education Commission (TEC) is responsible for funding all post-compulsory education and training offered by universities, polytechnics, colleges of education, wānanga, private training establishments, foundation education agencies, industry training organisations and adult and community education providers.
