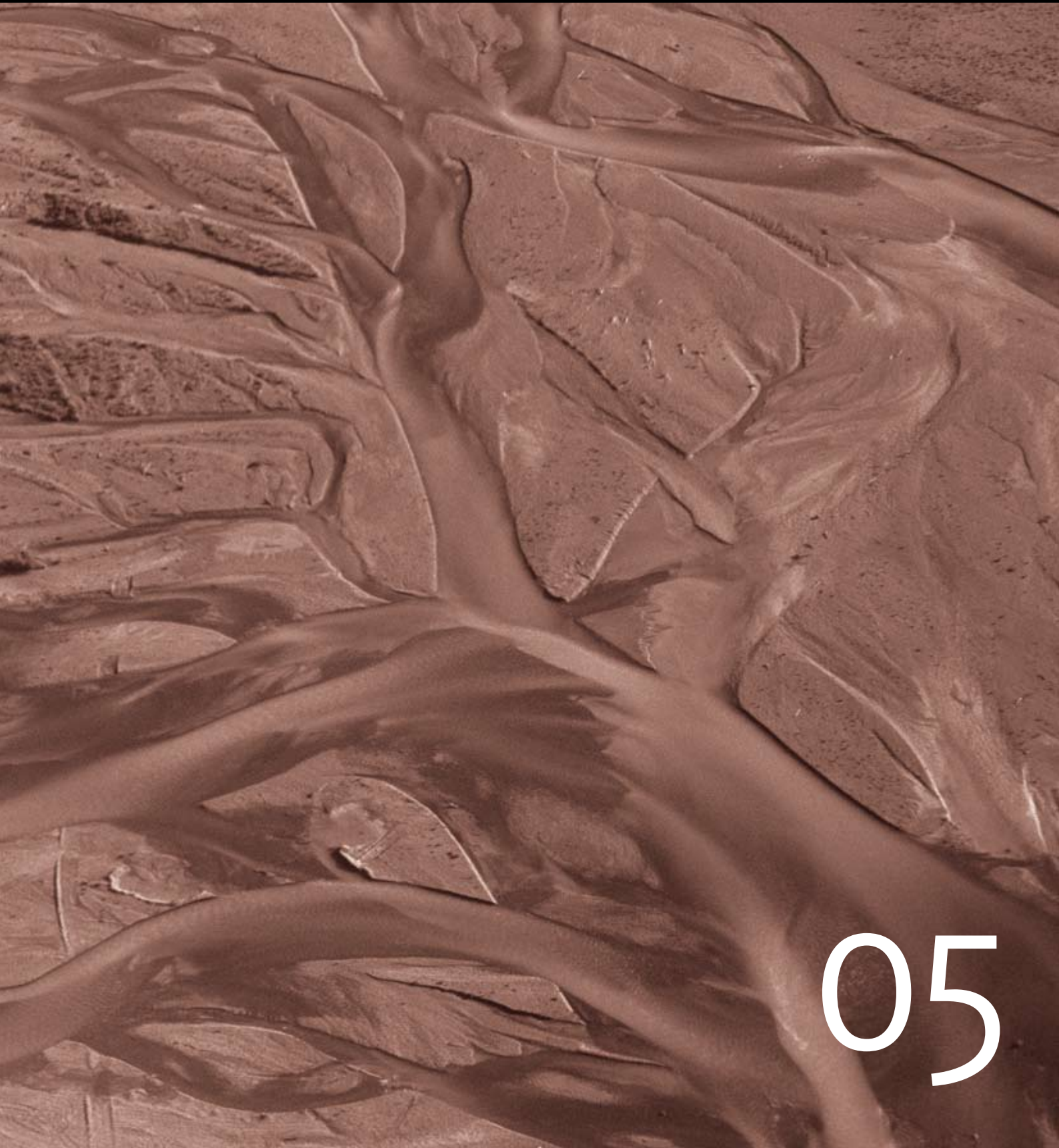

Glossary

Students

Domestic Student: A student who is either (a) a New Zealand citizen; (b) an Australian citizen; or (c) a permanent resident of New Zealand. Most domestic students qualify for the Ministry of Education EFTS-based tuition subsidy.

Equivalent Full-Time Students (EFTS): A measure of student load attributable to a part of a unit of study expressed as a proportion of the workload for a standard student load. The EFTS system is a method of counting tertiary student numbers. The basis of the EFTS system is that a student taking a normal year's full-time study equals 1.0 EFTS unit, and the courses taken by part-time students are fractions of one EFTS unit.

Enrolled Student: A student who has completed a tertiary provider's enrolment process as defined in the regulations set by that provider, according to the Education Act 1989.

Ethnicity: The ethnic group or groups to which a student belongs. A student may nominate up to three ethnic categories. For statistical purposes, each student is classified only by one ethnic group according to a standard hierarchical order (as defined by the Statistics New Zealand Standard Classification of Ethnicity). In some tables, the individual ethnic categories have been combined to form broad ethnic groups.

Exchange Student: An international student studying in New Zealand under an exchange programme approved by the New Zealand Government. The University has bi-lateral agreements with a number of overseas universities to exchange students, generally for a period of up to one year. Participants take courses at partner universities to substitute for courses that they would normally have taken as part of their degree programmes at their home universities.

First-Year Student: A student enrolled in the current year and identified as being in their first year at Canterbury University. Enrolments in community or other non-formal UC Opportunity courses are not included under this definition.

Foreign Student: Any student who does not meet the criteria for classification as a domestic student. Foreign students do not attract tertiary tuition subsidies and hence pay full-cost fees.

Full Fee Paying Student: A student who meets full tuition costs on their own or from funds provided to them by sponsors other than the New Zealand Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade.

International Student: An overseas student who has come to New Zealand for the purpose of education, and/or is currently studying on a student permit or diplomatic passport. This excludes students from overseas with New Zealand citizenship or permanent residence or with Australian citizenship.

Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade (MFAT) Student: A student on a scholarship from the New Zealand Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade.

National Student Index (NSI): The NSI is a system that assigns unique identifiers to tertiary students and National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA) candidates. The unique identifier will be a lifetime identification number that students keep even if they study at more than one provider. The NSI number will be used to collect and combine data for policy and analysis purposes. Information reported to the Ministry of Education will use NSI numbers instead of names or other codes.

The NSI number does not replace the identification numbers that providers assign to their students for internal purposes and it cannot be used by agencies outside of the education sector.

Postgraduate Student: A student, enrolled either full-time or part-time, who has already completed a Bachelor's degree and is undertaking courses or other non-thesis work at 400-level or above.

Research-based Postgraduate Student: Students studying level 8 courses (equivalent to 1.0 EFTS or more) in which a student's work is supervised and results in the production of a substantial research output amounting to 100 percent of the learning and assessment for the course or courses.

Thesis Student: A student enrolled either full-time or part-time in a Masters or Doctoral programme.

Student Headcount: This is equivalent to the number of individual students enrolled.

Unfunded EFTS: Students for whom the University receives no government funding; for example a full-time PhD student who has been enrolled in a doctoral programme for more than four years without exemption.

Undergraduate Student: A student studying for a Bachelor or other first degree. This can include papers at level 0 (certificates) but does not include community education and English Language short courses.

Staff

Academic Staff: Staff employed to perform the function of teaching, research or teaching and research.

Full-time Equivalent Staff (FTE): A measure used for reporting staff numbers. Generally speaking 1.0 FTE is equivalent to a staff member who is employed for 37.5 hours per week.

General Staff: Staff who otherwise are not classified as academic staff.

Casual Staff: A member of staff who is engaged and paid on an hourly or seasonal basis.

Other

Admission: The process of confirming that a student is eligible to enrol to study, and to continue to study, in qualification(s) and courses offered by a tertiary education provider.

Academic Unit: These units (Schools and Departments) employ staff engaged in the activities directly related to the University's teaching and research functions.

College Office: These units employ staff engaged in the administration of all Academic Units (includes School of Law).

Contract Teaching: Teaching provided under contract for students not enrolled as University of Canterbury students; for example, students taught under the Bachelor of Teaching and Learning contract that the University currently has with the Christchurch College of Education.

Corporate Services Units: These units provide services relating to the central administration of the University as a whole or to the planning, development and maintenance of the structure and functioning of the University, for example, student administration, planning and institutional research, financial services and human resources.

Course Occurrence Code: From mid September 2005, each offering of a course will be published with a course occurrence code, which will indicate the year, the teaching period, and the site where the course is taught. For example the Course Occurrence Code POLS 214-06S1 (U) is made up of:

- Course code: POLS 214
- Year Code: offered in 2006 (06)
- Teaching Period Code: Semester 1 (S1)
- Site Code: at the University campus (U)

Cultural Enrolment (Personal Interest Enrolment): Subject to certain conditions, enrolled students, members of staff and other persons may be permitted to attend lectures in courses offered by the University for cultural reasons, that is, for purposes other than credit towards a degree, diploma, certificate or professional qualification.

Enrolment: A formal agreement between a provider and a student which establishes the basis on which the student studies with the provider.

Financial Recovery Plan (FRP): A University of Canterbury financial management plan which ran from 2002 to 2006.

Funding Category: A funding level at which tertiary education courses are funded. This is determined by the Tertiary Education Commission/Ministry of Education's 1-39 Classification Prescription.

New Zealand Vice Chancellors' Committee (NZVCC): A committee established under s240 of the Education Act 1989, which comprises the vice-chancellors of the eight New Zealand universities. Among other things, the NZVCC is responsible for the final approval and quality assurance of university qualifications through its Committee on University Academic Programmes (CUAP).

Qualification: The official award given in recognition of the successful completion of a programme of study. A qualification must be approved by a recognised quality assurance agency and recognised by the Tertiary Education Commission to qualify for tertiary tuition funding.

Single Data Return (SDR): An electronic collection of student statistical and tertiary tuition student enrolment information provided to the Ministry of Education by providers. The tertiary tuition data and forecasts in the SDR contribute towards the determination of funding.

Special Supplementary Grant (SSG): Section 199 of the Education Act 1989 was repealed as part of the Education (Tertiary Reform) Amendment Act 2002, and new sections 159ZC and 159ZD replace it. Special Supplementary Grants are part of targeted funding, through a strategic component, and the Tertiary Education Commission may impose conditions on its use.

Student Services Units: These units provide services contributing to the welfare of students, for example, disability support services, health services and international student support services.

Tertiary Education Commission (TEC): The Tertiary Education Commission (TEC) is a crown entity responsible for funding all post-compulsory education and training offered by universities, polytechnics, colleges of education, wananga, private training establishments, foundation education agencies, industry training organisations and adult and community education providers.
