Student Services

Academic Skills Centre

The Academic Skills Centre offers courses and individual tuition to help students at all levels achieve academic success. The Writing and Study Skills Programme (WASS), primarily for students with English as a first language, teaches study skills, essay writing and science writing, with special classes for first year mature students and for postgraduates. The English Language Support Programme (ELSP), primarily for students from a non-English speaking background, offers similar support. Career Development and Employer Liaison Centre

Student Exchange Programmes

The University of Canterbury has bi-lateral agreements with a number of overseas universities to exchange students, generally for a period of up to one year. Participants take courses at partner universities to substitute for courses that they would normally have taken as part of their degree programmes at their home universities. Such courses taken at partner universities by University of Canterbury students must have been approved by the relevant Deans of Faculties and Heads of Department/School at the University of Canterbury prior to students taking part in exchange programmes*. A feature of all exchange agreements is that students pay for their tuition at their home university and not at the partner university.

University of Canterbury students who intend to go on exchange should attend an introductory seminar during semester one. Further information and application forms may be obtained from the

*Notwithstanding BA Regulation 2, BCom Regulation 1, and BSc Regulation 2, University of Canterbury students may be permitted to fulfil the requirement to include at least 56 points for 300-level courses in a single subject from the Schedule to the degree, by substituting equivalent courses of the partner university which have been approved prior to enrolment at the partner university.
