Honours, Merit and Distinction Procedures

Introduction

These procedures have been developed to assist with the award of Honours, Merit and Distinction for all degrees where appropriate.

Definitions

Grade Point Average (GPA) – A system of recording academic achievement based on an averaging process of the grades. The process is defined in the <u>General Conditions for Credit Regulations (University Regulations website)</u>.

Procedures

Award rules

- 1. Honours may only be awarded to Honours Degrees.
- 2. All postgraduate qualifications, other than Honours degrees, may be awarded with Merit or Distinction, unless otherwise specified in individual qualifications. Undergraduate degrees, other than Honours degrees, and graduate qualifications are not awarded with Honours, Merit or Distinction.

Making an award

- 1. After a student's GPA has been calculated, recommendations for the award of Honours, Distinction and Merit are made by the relevant Dean or nominee in conjunction with:
 - i. the requirements as set out in the notes to regulation 11 of the <u>General Conditions</u> for Credit Regulations (University Regulations website); and

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- ii. the requirements as set out in regulation 6 (Time Limits) and regulation 9 (Honours, Distinction and Merit) of the relevant qualification regulation requirement.
- 2. The specification of the break-points for various classes of Honours, Merit or Distinction is given in regulation 11 of the <u>General Conditions for Credit Regulations</u> (<u>University Regulations website</u>).

As a guideline, deviations of up to 0.05 Grade Points can be approved at the discretion of the relevant Dean or their nominee, while deviations above this would normally only be made in consultation with the Academic Administration Committee or its executive.

Information to be supplied and shared

- 1. Faculties must provide information for students on the calculation of Honours for its particular degrees either in the qualification regulations or in a publicly accessible programme handbook. This information must include details of which courses are or are not included in the calculations and the weightings given to courses and parts of degree programmes, as per either the general or specific qualification regulations.
- 2. Faculty Offices must ensure that all departments and schools are aware of
 - i. the need to inform students on the normal practice for calculating Honours, including any special weightings applied to particular courses or parts of degree programmes; and
 - ii. the requirement that all recommendations for the award of Honours be approved by the relevant Dean or nominee.
