

Lockdown

Get notified → get to a safe location → wait for more information.

- A lockdown involves the securing of all internal and external doors of buildings on campus, including all halls of residence.
- In the event of a lockdown, the University's objective is to ensure all persons on campus stay safe and stay informed.

If you're on campus in the event of a lockdown:

1. **Remain inside**, move into your building's designated safe spot, stay away from windows and await further instruction.
2. **If you are outside** when the emergency notification is received, proceed to the nearest building.
3. **If the building has been locked** upon your arrival, leave campus for a safe location.
4. **If you are a visitor arriving on campus**, leave campus for a safe location.
5. **Further instruction:** UC's emergency personnel and/or communications team will advise when the lockdown has been lifted and it's safe to leave the building.

During a lockdown all persons on campus must comply with instruction provided by the University's emergency personnel.

Instruction will be distributed via:

- Help Point towers
- UCGo mobile app – emergency push notifications. If you have not already downloaded and logged into the app, **do this now** to ensure you receive notifications in the event of an emergency.
 - » The app is free from both Google Play and the iTunes app store.
 - » Login using your staff/student login details.
