Nau mai, tauti mai | Welcome

Tēnā koutou e ngā kaiwhiwhi tohu paetahi, tohu paerua, tohu kairangi hoki o Te Whare Wānanga o Waitaha. Nau mai, tauti mai ki te hapori mātauranga o te whare wānanga nei.

Greetings to you, the recipients of certificates, diplomas and degrees from Te Whare Wānanga o Waitaha | University of Canterbury. Welcome to the community of scholars from this university.

Congratulations on your achievements, and the hard work and dedication that has earned you the right to take your place on the graduation stage.

By graduating, you're joining 155,000 University of Canterbury alumni providing invaluable contributions to the world around us.

Take your place amongst them, and the great innovators and history-makers who came before, and add to our great story, which began over 150 years ago.

Academic dress

All those graduating at Aotearoa New Zealand universities are required to wear full academic dress.

The colour of the hood lining denotes the different faculties or degrees, except for the peony red PhD hood.

In recent years, University of Canterbury graduands have embellished their graduation regalia with garments of honour from their own tradition such as a kākahu/korowai or ta'ovala and we encourage this colourful addition to the ceremonies and celebrations. Some graduands and graduates carry flower posies or wear corsages/buttonholes.

On the day of graduation, you are required to wear appropriate academic dress when taking part in the celebration. **If you are not wearing academic dress, you will not be able to participate in the celebration.**

Hiring your academic dress

The University of Canterbury's academic dress stock is owned and maintained by GWC Regalia Hire. This organisation operates on a voluntary basis and uses all profits from the regalia hire to fund scholarships, research fellowships, and maintain a trust fund for charitable purposes, including purchasing more academic dress.

Process of ordering Regalia

- Follow the link provided by GWC Regalia Hire – Click the [link](#).
- Click on University of Canterbury
- Select Ceremony
- If your celebration is on Thursday and you want to attend the Wednesday street parade, please click the box '10am Chch Graduation

Celebration Parade' so you can collect your regalia early.

- Confirm Regalia – include your height and head measurement.
- Enter Payment Details – Confirm Payment. A confirmation email will be sent to your inbox if the order is successful. If not, check spam/junk inbox and your bank account.

Collecting your academic dress

Collect your academic dress from Dovedale Campus, Wairarapa Building, Block ED15.

A reminder email will be sent three days prior to the graduation which includes a map and information about your collection day and return time. You can collect on the day of your ceremony.

If you are unable to collect your regalia at the specified time, you may ask someone to collect it for you. **Please ensure your height and head measurements are on the order.** Measure your head circumference above your ears. The measurement should be between 50 – 67cm. If you have long hair, please measure with your hair out.

Your academic regalia must be returned to the same location it was collected from before the required time. Anyone can return your regalia; however, its safe return is the responsibility of the hirer.

A security hold of \$50 will be placed on your card at the time of collection. Please make sure that you have enough funds available to cover this amount. The hold will be automatically released after seven days if the regalia is returned on time, dry, undamaged, and without heavy soiling.

How to wear your academic dress

Academic dress consists of a gown, a hood and a trencher (black cap with tassel).

Gown

The Bachelor gown is worn with the hands going through the slits at the top of the sleeve not down through the bottom of the sleeve. Master gowns have a closed sleeve but it's obvious where your arm goes. A Master gown is also used as a PhD gown.

Hood

The hood is held in position by a neckband which joins the two sides together at the sternum. This band is held by a ribbon provided as per the video demonstration. **Pins are not to be used to secure the hood as these damage the satin fabric.** The right shoulder is grey, and the left shoulder shows the faculty colour lining, however if you are graduating with a PhD, this is reversed.

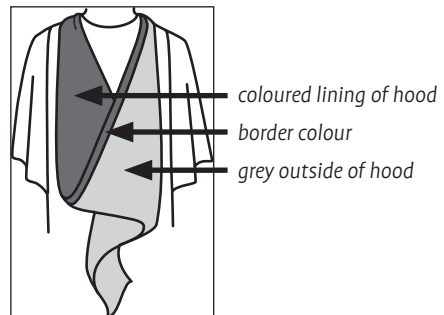


The easiest way to put the hood on is to hold out the hood with the GWC Regalia Hire label facing out and flip it over your head. The back of the hood drapes diagonally across the back showing the band which signifies the level of your qualification ie: Bachelor, Bachelor Hons, Master. If you are receiving two degrees at the same ceremony, you can wear the hood for either degree, but not together. You must wear your highest qualification.

Hat

The trencher (mortarboard) is worn shorter peak to the front, the top is flat on your head, with tassel over your left eye. For PhD and doctoral degrees the headgear is a black velvet beret. If the trencher is thrown and the corner is damaged, this can't be repaired and a full replacement of the trencher is charged.

If you are having a diploma awarded and have no other degree, wear only the gown (no trencher or hood). If you already have a degree, you will receive a University of Canterbury stole, the gown of your highest qualification and a trencher.





Colour of hoods

The hoods are of a standard size and shape with a slate grey or navy exterior. Honours and Master's degrees (for most faculties) are distinguished by having a border on the exterior (Honours is 25mm wide and Masters is 75mm) of the same colour as the interior of the hood. You will be shown images of your chosen regalia during the online ordering process.

Hood colours

- Arts – Baby Pink
- Commerce – Yellow
- Education – Brown
- Engineering – Violet
- Forestry – Chestnut
- Health Sciences – Emerald Green
- Law & Criminal Justice – Ice Blue
- Music & Fine Arts – White
- Science – Ultramarine
- Social Work – Post Office Red
- Speech & Language Pathology/Audiology – Magenta
- Sport Coaching – Post Office Red
- Teaching & Learning – Old Gold
- PhDs – Peony Red

Staff colours

The rich variety of academic dress (and colours) worn by the academic staff reflects the many different universities which they attended.

University officers wear peony red gowns. The Tumu Kaunihera | Chancellor's gown is damask embroidered with gold and gold lace, and the trencher is peony red with gold lace and a gold tassel. The Tumu Whakarae | Vice-Chancellor's gown is damask embroidered with gold and the trencher is peony red with a gold tassel. The Pourouki | Registrar's gown is silk embroidered with gold and the trencher is peony red with a red tassel.

The graduation celebration

There will be five celebrations and a parade through the city centre in Ōtautahi Christchurch in April 2024.

- Tuesday 9 April, 2pm, Science
- Wednesday 10 April, 10am, city parade
- Wednesday 10 April, 2pm, Business and Law
- Thursday 11 April, 10am, Arts and Product Design
- Thursday 11 April, 2pm, Education and Health

Guest tickets and procession into Wolfbrook Arena

Each University of Canterbury graduate is allocated five tickets for guests to attend their graduation celebration.

Guests must be seated by 9.20am for the morning celebration and 1.20pm for the afternoon celebration.

Students and guests with a disability

Morning procession

Graduates must assemble at the signposted area in the main carpark on Twigger Street **no later than 9am**.

Afternoon procession

Graduates must assemble at the signposted area main carpark on Twigger Street **no later than 1pm**.

Processions begin 15 minutes prior to the start of a graduation ceremony. Marshals will provide instruction as to the procession order.

The procession is filmed and projected onto the screens inside the Arena.

What to bring to the Marshalling Area

When you arrive at the Marshalling Area you should be dressed in your regalia with your graduation seat number.

Please do not carry anything that does not fit in your pockets as you might not return to the same seat after you cross the stage. For this reason, it is best not to bring cell phones, cameras, flowers or handbags with you to the Marshalling Area.

Cancellation procedures

If the procession into the venue is cancelled due to weather, please assemble at the rear of the main stage of Wolfbrook Arena, entering through Gate 1.

Participation in the procession is not optional. If there is a reason that you are unable to take part in the procession, please contact events@canterbury.ac.nz by Friday 5 April.

In the case of bad weather, please refer to the following channels for updates regarding the possible cancellation of the procession; watch for text alerts, check your official university email, and UC's Facebook page.



Celebration procedure

- You will move into the Arena and proceed to your seats. You will sit down, still wearing your trencher.
- Graduates will rise when Fanfare is sounded for the entrance of the academic procession.
- Graduates will remain standing for the pao – a representative group of graduates will be welcomed into the Arena.
- Graduates and the audience will then be seated for the mihi.
- Remove your trencher (it is replaced as you leave the stage).
- A waiata will be sung.
- Graduates and audience will stand for the Aotearoa New Zealand National Anthem.
- Once everyone is seated the Tumu Kaunihera Chancellor will convene the ceremony.

All graduates are called singly. If you are carrying a posy, leave it on your seat before proceeding to the stage.

When your name is called:

- Walk across the stage to the Tumu Kaunihera Chancellor and bow your head to be doffed.
- Don your trencher.
- Continue down the steps to collect your certificate at the end of the aisle.
- Return to your seat.

Please remain seated during the musical interlude.

- After the presentations are completed, there will be a graduation address.
- The celebration will be closed by the Tumu Whakarae | Vice-Chancellor.
- As Gaudeamus is played, please stand.
- Once the academic party is clear of the stage, the Marshals will indicate for you to follow them into the foyer.

If you find you are unable to attend the celebration in person, you must notify graduation@canterbury.ac.nz to discuss what options are available.

Your academic documents

What are academic documents?

Academic documents provide evidence of your study at the University of Canterbury and include Academic Transcripts; Testamurs (Qualification or Certificates) and Official Letters.

Why do I need academic documents?

You may need to supply official evidence of study for:

- Entrance to other tertiary institutes in Aotearoa New Zealand or overseas
- Employment
- Government benefits or emigration

Can I get digital copies?

Yes, any eligible University of Canterbury student or graduate can receive academic documents through My eEquals. It's a secure online platform used by 47 participating universities where you can view and share your official documents with third parties.

You can also order a Letter of Eligibility to Graduate or Letter of Conferment of Qualification to be accessed on My eEquals. Other official letters may be provided on a case-by-case basis. Digital letters can be ordered at www.canterbury.ac.nz/study/study-support-info/study-topics/transcripts-and-official-letters.



How do I get a paper copy?

You will receive a paper copy of your Testamur at your graduation celebration. For paper copies of your transcript and letters you can submit a request online at www.canterbury.ac.nz/study/study-support-info/study-topics/transcripts-and-official-letters. If you are subsequently unable to attend your graduation celebration, your testamur will be mailed to you in due course.

How much do academic documents cost?

Digital documents provided automatically upon graduation are free of charge. You'll receive an email from My eEquals with instructions and a link.
