Admission to the Qualification

To be admitted to the Master of Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages a student must:

- (a) have satisfied the Admission Regulations for admission to the University: and
- (b) have either:
 - i. qualified for an appropriate Bachelor's degree with a B grade point average or better; or
 - ii. been admitted with Academic Equivalent Standing; and
- (c) have been approved as a student by the Dean of Education and Health Sciences.

Notes: The relevance and standard of undergraduate studies and any subsequent professional work experience are the main criteria of approval.

Pathways

Students who wish to leave the programme before completing the MTESOL may be able to credit courses towards a PGCertTESOL or PGDipEd(TLL) or another qualification.

Students looking for a more flexible programme with just some of the MTESOL courses may consider the 180-point Master of Education endorsed in Teaching and Learning Languages course pathway. Those who wish to pursue thesis study may consider the 180-point Master of Education endorsed in Teaching and Learning Languages thesis pathway.

Duration

The MTESOL is usually completed in twelve months, although part-time study is possible. The MTESOL begins in February or November for fulltime students.
