Te Tono Motuhēhē Discretionary Application 2019

Ngā Paearu Hei Whakamotuhēhē Te Urunga Ki Te Kura Ture Criteria for discretionary entrance

For some years the demand for places in the School of Law has meant that restrictions on entry have had to be imposed on second year courses.

Under the regulations, in any year up to 10 students of Māori descent may be admitted to the second year courses in addition to the places otherwise available. To be eligible a student must have achieved at least a C- pass in LAWS 101, Legal System: Legal Method and Institutions and LAWS 110, Legal Foundations, Research and Writing, or be a graduate.

Application (using this form) is required for entry under these provisions, and when selection is necessary successful applicants will be chosen by a Selection Committee comprising a representative of the Māori Student Development Team and a representative of the School of Law. Applicants may be interviewed at a time and place to be advised.
