1. Aronga | Purpose

The scholarship supports aspirational leadership in Aotearoa New Zealand, to grow the knowledge and skillsets to improve lives, businesses, and communities by transforming vision into reality. It supports students in developing commercial leadership capability and in obtaining an MBA qualification from Te Kura Umanga | UC Business School at Te Whare Wānanga o Waitaha | University of Canterbury.

2. Paearu māraurau | Eligibility criteria

- 2.1 New MBA/PGDipBA applicants: Applicants must be intending to enrol in a programme for an MBA degree at the University (either via the direct MBA pathway or via enrolling in a PGDipBA) in February of the year following the year of application.
- 2.2 MBA/PGDipBA students who newly enrolled in September of the year of application are also eligible.

3. Tukanga tononga | Application process

Applications must be made online at the Scholarships website⁴ by 20 November.

4. Tukanga kōwhiringa | Selection process

4.1 Three scholarships are available annually.

4.2 The scholarship is awarded by Te Kaunihera | University Council on the recommendation of a selection committee comprising:

- a. the Tumu Whakarae | Vice-Chancellor (or nominee);
- b. the MBA Director (or nominee);
- c. two representatives of the Gough Family Office.⁵

5. Paearu kōwhiringa | Selection criteria

5.1 In making the recommendations, the selection committee gives equal consideration to:

- a. potential for success in the MBA programme at the University;
- b. commercial capability and potential;
- c. demonstrated leadership potential;
- d. character; and
- e. commitment to the applicant's impact in the community (local and global).

5.2 Before the selection committee makes its final recommendations, short-listed candidates may be required to attend an interview conducted by the selection committee.

5.3 If, in any year, there are fewer candidates of sufficient merit than there are scholarships available, fewer scholarships are offered.

6. Mahere utu | Value and payment schedule

6.1 The scholarship provides up to \$40,000, comprising the following:

- a. Tuition fees support at a value of \$32,000 for up to 180 points of enrolment.¹
- b. The opportunity to participate in, during the first two calendar years of tenure of the scholarship, an Outward Bound² leadership course, with the course fee paid by the scholarship.⁶
- c. The opportunity to participate in a bespoke leadership skills programme during the first two calendar years of tenure of the scholarship (with the course fees paid by the scholarship) provided in conjunction with Te Kura Umanga | UC Business School.⁶
- d. The opportunity to participate in leadership mentoring.

6.2 The tuition fees support is paid to a recipient's tuition fees account.

7. Paearu here | Tenability and retention criteria

7.1 The scholarship must be taken up in February of the year following the year of application.

7.2 The scholarship is tenable during full-time or part-time enrolment in a programme for an MBA at the University. In the first year of tenure, recipients must complete the MBAM 610 leadership course.³

7.3 The scholarship is tenable for up to 180 points of enrolment.

7.4 The scholarship is co-tenable with any other award unless the conditions of the other award preclude this.

7.5 Recipients are expected to participate in, during the first two calendar years of tenure of the scholarship, the Outward Bound² leadership course and the bespoke leadership skills programme.

- 7.6 A recipient, with the permission of the Amo Matua, Umanga | Executive Dean of Business (or nominee), may retain their scholarship while enrolled as a distance student or while carrying out research for specified periods outside the University.
- 7.7 The scholarship may be withdrawn, and any paid funds may be recovered if, during tenure, a recipient does not:
- maintain an enrolment that meets the conditions specified in clause 7.2;
 - maintain satisfactory academic engagement and progress;⁷ and
 - adhere to the University's statutes, regulations, policies, and rules.

8. Whakamahuki | Background information
