## THE BRIAN MORRISON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP IN ENGINEERING

This scholarship has been endowed by the late Mr W. Gordon Morrison and Mrs Morrison in memory of their son Brian, a past Chairman of the Engineering Society. The endowment specifies an annual award to engineering students attending the University of Canterbury, particularly overseas engineering students, who are considered "likely in their future lives to promote and foster racial tolerance, co-operation, and understanding, which our son during his lifetime and while a student at the said university earnestly sought".

- 1. This scholarship shall be known as the Brian Morrison Memorial Scholarship in Engineering.
- 2. One scholarship shall normally be awarded each year by the Council of the University of Canterbury after it has received a report on the character and suitability of the applicants from a Scholarship Committee consisting of:
  - i. the Vice-Chancellor or nominee;
  - ii. the Dean of Engineering or nominee;

If accumulated funds permit the Council may award additional scholarships in any year.

- 3. Each scholarship shall be for one year only.
- 4. The scholarship may be held only by full-time students of the University of Canterbury who have completed, or who have been exempted from, the Engineering Intermediate examination and are taking subjects of the Professional courses leading to the degree of Bachelor of Engineering with Honours. The holder of the scholarship, and previous holders, may apply for the award in subsequent years. The scholarship may be held with any other bursary, scholarship, prize or tertiary allowance, unless the conditions of the other awards preclude it.
- 5. The Council may, on the recommendation of the Academic Board, withdraw any scholarship at any time, and determine the emoluments payable thereunder, if it is satisfied that the holder of the scholarship is not diligently pursuing the prescribed course, or has failed to comply with the terms and conditions under which the scholarship is awarded.
- 6. Applications shall be in sufficient detail for the Scholarship Committee to determine the extent to which the applicant satisfies the expressed wish of the donor.
- 7. Applications must be in writing and must be in the hands of the Registrar no later than 5.00 p.m. on 31 March.

NOTE: The current value of the scholarship is \$1,000 per annum.
