

Electrical & Electronic Engineering Excellence Prize

Waeture | Regulations

The prize recognises academic achievement in Pūhanga Hiko | Electrical and Electronic Engineering at Te Whare Wānanga o Waitaha | University of Canterbury.

- 1. The prize is a monetary award at a value of \$500.
- 2. Two prizes, of which one is reserved for female students, are available annually to students who, in the year of the award, completed a programme for a BE (Hons) in Electrical and Electronic Engineering at the University.
- 3. The prize is awarded by Te Kaunihera | University Council on the recommendation of the Tumuaki Tari | Head of the Department of Te Tari Pūhanga Hangarau | Electrical and Computer Engineering (or nominee).
- 4. In making the recommendation, the Tumuaki Tari | Head of the Department (or nominee) considers academic achievement in BE (Hons) Electrical and Electronic Engineering.
- 5. If, in any year, there are more than two candidates deemed worthy of the award, the prize is awarded to each and the value is divided equally among them.
- 6. If, in any year, there are no candidates of sufficient merit, no prize is offered.
- 7. The prize is paid by direct credit to a recipient's nominated New Zealand bank account.
- 8. A condition of acceptance is that a recipient permits announcement and publication of acceptance of the award.
