J R TEMPLIN BURSARY

The Bursary was established in 1946 by a gift from J R Templin Esq., A.I.E.E., to assist students in the final year of the course for the B.E.(Hons) degree.

- 1. One bursary shall be awarded in each year, tenable for one year.
- 2. The bursary shall be awarded by the Council after considering the recommendation of the Academic Board and Engineering.
- 3. Candidates for the bursary shall have completed or been exempted from all the subjects of their First and Second Professional year courses at the University of Canterbury for the degree of Bachelor of Engineering with Honours.
- 4. In making the award preference shall be given to a candidate whose work and progress have been worthy, and whose financial circumstances are such that he or she would have difficulty in completing his or her course without financial assistance. No candidate will be considered if he or she holds any award or other form of financial assistance.
- 5. The tenure of the bursary may be terminated at any time by the Council should it receive from Engineering an unfavourable report on the conduct or progress of the holder.
- 6. Should no award be made in any year the income from the fund for that year shall be applied by the Council to the best interests of the bursary.
- 7. Application for the bursary shall be made in writing and must be in the hands of the Registrar no later than 5.00 p.m. on 31 March in any year, but the Council shall not be debarred from making an award to a student who has made no formal application.

NOTE: The current value of the bursary is \$1,000 per annum.
