# Rotary Club of Belfast–Kaiapoi Disability Scholarship

#### 1. Purpose

This scholarship supports undergraduate students at the University of Canterbury who have a disability.

#### 2. Eligibility criteria

- 2.1 Applicants must be citizens of New Zealand.
- 2.2 Applicants must have a disability that would qualify them to be registered with the University's Te Ratonga Whaikaha | Student Accessibility Service.<sup>1</sup>
- 2.3 Preference is given to applicants whose last year of secondary education was in North Canterbury.<sup>2</sup>

#### 3. Selection process

- 3.1 One scholarship is available annually.
- 3.2 The scholarship is awarded by the Council of the University on the recommendation of a selection committee comprising:
  - a. the Vice-Chancellor (or nominee); and
  - b. the Team Leader of the University's Te Ratonga Whaikaha | Student Accessibility Service (or nominee).

#### 4. Selection criteria

- 4.1 In making the recommendation the selection committee gives equal weighting to:
  - a. academic achievement; and
  - b. the applicant's assessment of how the scholarship would benefit him or her.

Preference is given to applicants whose last year of secondary education was in North Canterbury.<sup>2</sup>

4.2 If, in any year, there is no candidate of sufficient merit, no award is made.

## 5. Application process

Applications must be made online at the Scholarships website<sup>3</sup> by 15 August.

## 6. Tenability

- 6.1 The scholarship is tenable for one year.
- 6.2 The scholarship is tenable by students enrolled, full-time or part-time, in a first year of a programme for an undergraduate degree at the University.
- 6.3 The scholarship is co-tenable with any award unless the conditions of the other award preclude this.

# 7. Value and payment schedule

- 7.1 The scholarship has a value of \$3,000.
- 7.2 The scholarship is paid by direct credit to a recipient's nominated New Zealand bank account.
- 7.3 The payment is made as soon as practicable after:
  - a. the recipient has accepted the scholarship;
  - confirmation that the recipient is registered with the University's Te Ratonga Whaikaha | Student Accessibility Service (see clause 8.3);<sup>1</sup>
  - c. confirmation that the recipient's enrolment meets the conditions specified in clause 6.2; and
  - d. the final dates on which a student may receive a full refund for withdrawal from a course.4

## 8. Conditions of acceptance

- 8.1 The scholarship must be taken up in the year following the year of application for the scholarship.
- 8.2 Unless otherwise specified in the offer letter, an offer of a scholarship lapses if it is not formally accepted within one calendar month of the date of the offer.
- 8.3 The recipient must be registered with the University's Te Ratonga Whaikaha | Student Accessibility Service.<sup>1</sup>
- 8.4 In the event where a recipient's enrolment during tenure of the scholarship no longer meets the conditions specified in clause 6.2, the scholarship is withdrawn and any paid funds may be recovered.
- 8.5 By accepting the award, the recipient:
  - a. permits publication and announcement of their acceptance; and
  - b. agrees to provide a letter of thanks to the Rotary Club of Belfast–Kaiapoi.<sup>5</sup>
- 8.6 Continuation of a scholarship is conditional on satisfactory academic engagement<sup>6</sup> and adherence to the University's statutes and regulations.

## 9. Background information

Belfast Rotary Disability Trust donated funds to the University in their 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary year to support students with disabilities. In 2017, the Rotary Club of Belfast–Kaiapoi's 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary year, the fund was worth \$83,000. The club established the scholarship in 2020, for awards to be made in perpetuity.
