Sibu UC Alumni Chapter Malaysian Undergraduate Prize



Regulations

The prize recognises academic excellence in undergraduate students from central Sarawak¹ in any year of an undergraduate degree programme at the University of Canterbury.

- 1. The prize comprises a monetary award to a value of \$2,000.
- 2. Two prizes are available annually, to students with a permanent address in central Sarawak, Malaysia who, in the year of the award, were enrolled full-time at the University.
- 3. The prize is awarded by the Council of the University on the recommendation of the University of Canterbury Foundation Director (or nominee).
- 4. In making the recommendation, the Director (or nominee) considers academic achievement in the year of the award.
- 5. If, in any year, there are fewer than two candidates of sufficient merit, fewer than two prizes are awarded.
- 6. The prize is paid to a recipient's nominated New Zealand bank account.
- 7. A condition of acceptance is that a recipient permits announcement and publication of acceptance of the award.

History of the award: The prize was established in 2019. It replaces the Sibu Malaysian Alumni Scholarship, which was established in 2016. The University's Sibu Malaysian alumni recognise the contribution their University of Canterbury degrees have made to their own lives and to those of their families, and they fund this prize to help a new generation of students from central Sarawak who are attending their alma mater.
