1. Aronga | Purpose

The scholarship supports students at Te Whare Wānanga o Waitaha | University of Canterbury who studied at Southland Boys' High School or Southland Girls' High School.

2. Paearu māraurau | Eligibility criteria

In the year of application (or in previous year if they were on a gap year),¹ applicants must:

- have been enrolled at either Southland Boys' High School or Southland Girls' High School; and
- have been studying for a University Entrance qualification or equivalent.²

3. Tukanga tononga | Application process

Applications must be made online at the Scholarships website³ by 15 August.

4. Tukanga kōwhiringa | Selection process

- 4.1 Two scholarships are available annually: normally one for applicants from Southland Boys' High School and one for applicants from Southland Girls' High School. If, in any year, there are no applicants from one of the schools, both scholarships are made available to applicants from the other school.
- 4.2 The scholarship is awarded by Te Kaunihera | University Council on the recommendation of a selection committee comprising:
 - the Tumu Whakarae | Vice-Chancellor (or nominee); and

- b. the Kaitakawaenga | Liaison Officer for Murihiku Southland (or nominee).

5. Paearu kōwhiringa | Selection criteria

- 5.1 In making the recommendations, the selection committee considers academic achievement, as indicated by quality of achievement at NCEA Level 2 or in equivalent university entrance qualifications.
- 5.2 If, in any year, there is no candidate of sufficient merit from one of the schools, the scholarship available to applicants from that school may be offered to an applicant from the other school.
- 5.3 If, in any year, there are fewer candidates of sufficient merit than there are scholarships available, fewer scholarships are offered.

6. Mahere utu | Value and payment schedule

- 6.1 The scholarship provides financial assistance at a value of \$1,200.
- 6.2 The scholarship is paid by direct credit to the recipient's nominated New Zealand bank account.
- 6.3 The scholarship is paid as soon as practicable after:
 - a. the final date, in the first semester of enrolment, on which a student may receive a full refund for withdrawal from a course;⁴ and
 - b. confirmation of enrolment as specified in clause 7.2.

7. Paearu here | Tenability and retention criteria

- 7.1 The scholarship must be taken up in the year following the year of application.
- 7.2 The scholarship is tenable during full-time enrolment at the University.
- 7.3 The scholarship is tenable for one year.
- 7.4 The scholarship is co-tenable with any other award unless the conditions of the other award preclude this.
- 7.5 In the event where a recipient's enrolment in the year of tenure no longer meets the conditions specified in clause 7.2, the scholarship is withdrawn and any paid funds may be recovered.
- 7.6 Continuation of a scholarship is conditional on satisfactory academic progress and adherence to the University's statutes, regulations, policies, and rules.

8. Whakamahuki | Background information

This scholarship was established as a prize in 1998 by the University of Canterbury Students' Association, in recognition of the many years of service to the Association of Lloyd Lilley, a Life Member, who served the Association from 1981 to 2004. In 2001, in consultation with Mr Lilley, the regulations were amended to allow awarding as a scholarship.
