

S P A HARRISON MEMORIAL PRIZE IN ENGINEERING GEOLOGY

This award was established in 1981 by friends and colleagues of Stephen Harrison in commemoration of his life and endeavour. At the time of his death, in a road accident, he was a graduate student of the University engaged in thesis research for the degree of Master of Science in Engineering Geology.

1. The award will be known as the S P A Harrison Memorial Prize in Engineering Geology.
2. The prize shall consist of a sum of money, the amount to be determined annually and to be paid from the income derived by the trust fund. More than one monetary prize may be awarded annually.
3. The award will be made annually to the student presenting the most meritorious written contribution in any Engineering Geology course. The award may be withheld if no student contribution is considered to be of sufficient academic merit.
4. The awards will be made by the Council of the University of Canterbury on the recommendation of the Head of the Department of Geological Sciences. No application is required.
5. The Council may from time to time amend these Regulations on the recommendation of the Head of the Department of Geological Sciences, provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of this award.

NOTE: The current value of the award is \$200.
